Speaking, Listening and Writing	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Write a diary entry or letter home from a Spartan soldier going to Troy. 2. Write a poem for Easter and rehearse it to read aloud in class. 3. Log on to BBC School’s Radio Music and enjoy singing the songs from Troy. Can you compose a new verse for one of the songs and perform it for your class or teacher?
Problems, Science and Maths	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Draw a diagram to show the parts of the circulatory system and explain how it works. 2. Choose a multiplication table that you need to work on and practise it, then ask a teacher to test you and reward you with class points. 3. Research and write a fact-file about a Greek mathematician e.g. Pythagoras.
Art and Design	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Design a costume or set for a character or scene in a play of Troy. 2. Design a new front cover for a book you have studied in class or one of your favourite free choice books. 3. Can you design and create a sel-portrait using your own choice of media, e.g. collage, paint, sculpture. Maybe you could use some recycled materials to continue with our sustainability theme.
